

WAIKOWHAI INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL ENROLMENT SCHEME

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below and shown on the map attached shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

The Waikowhai Intermediate School Zone is described as including all addresses that are geographically located within an area that commences at Hugh Watt Drive on Onehunga Bay and follows the shoreline of the Manukau Harbour west to Lynfield Cove.

At Lynfield Cove the zone boundary follows a path north through the Waraiki Steam Reserve bisecting Lynfield Place and Tropicana Drive to a point where White Swan and Hillsborough Roads intersect at and inclusive of number 624 Hillsborough Road.

From this point the zone extends northeast along White Swan Road, commencing at number 148 on the south east side of the street and at number 145 on the north west side and including all addresses along the north eastern pathway of White Swan Road, to a point where White Swan Road intersects Richardson Road.

The zone then extends southeast along the center of Richardson Road to a point where Richardson Road and Dominion Road Extension meet. At this point the zone follows a northeast path across Akarana Golf Course and Keith Hay Park to the foot of Arundel Street at which point the zone follows Keith Hay Park's eastern boundary northeast to intersect with the proposed Hugh Watt Drive extension. The zone then travels southeast along the center of Hugh Watt Drive to the commencement point at Onehunga Bay.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date, which will be published in a daily, or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the Board to assess the number of places that can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board will determine the number of places, which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority: This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run any special programme approved by the Secretary of Education.

Second Priority: Will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

Third Priority: Will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.

Fourth Priority: Will be given to applicants who are children of Board employees.

Fifth Priority: Will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.
